Always Remember:

- •It is ILLEGAL to keep most species the wild. Each species of animal of wildlife without state and federal has a very specific diet and any permits.
 - Knowledge of proper diet, housing and handling is essential to their well-being.

 - •It is cruel to cage and make pets of animals that will eventually resent their confinement.
 - Wild animals are unpredictble and potentially dangerous.

Release

The bigest reward that our volunteer staff receives, is to watch the release of a rehabilitated animal. The process of rehabilitating wildlife can be very demanding on someone. Baby animals can need feedings as often as every two hours. This all culminates with the release.
